Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

It's National Fresh Fruits and Vegetables Month! Here, at Hope Partners, we are so passionate about helping families access these yummy foods that pack such a healthful punch that we boast three Healthy Living Programs: the Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market, the Gleaning Hope Program, and our partnership with Amy's Farm. Today, I'd like to use this month's blessings piece to highlight our market.



Did you know Hope Partners' market is one of THE first ever farmers' markets in Los Angeles County? It's true: the farmers' market was founded in the early 1980's shortly after California approved legislation enabling farmers to sell their own produce directly to consumers. The market, with its dual focus of helping low-income families access fresh produce while also providing a venue for local food producers to sell their items and increase their income, was a natural progression of our organization's work in the area of food justice. The Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market has continued to cater to the needs of our community, especially our low-income neighbors, by being one of the few farmers' markets in the area to accept WIC, EBT, and other mainstream benefits, and the only market in this part of the county to work with Hunger Action LA to provide the Market Match program, through which low-income customers receive a 2:1 match on their benefits to increase the quantity of products they are able to purchase. With this same goal, the market will once again be a participant in the WIC Farmers' Market Nutrition Program this summer. In recent years, the market has also focused on bringing in more high-quality, chemical-free foods at affordable prices for our local community through partnership with Amy's Farm and the Pomona Community Farmer Alliance.

Hope Partners' Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market is open for business every Saturday, and we encourage you to check out all it has to offer! This time of year, market stands are bursting with apricots, cherries, blueberries, bok choy, swiss chard, cucumbers, sweet potatoes, and many other yummy fruits and vegetables to enjoy. Visit our farmers' market Saturday mornings in the parking lot of Purpose Church (NW corner of Pearl and Garey in Pomona) from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. We hope to see you there soon!
