Emergency Food Drives

Why food drives?

Food drives are a way to support Inland Valley Hope services to the hungry and homeless in our valley. It supplements food received through the Regional Food Bank. Food from food drives alleviates the need to purchase large quantities of non-perishable foods.

By operating efficiently and utilizing donated food resources, the Inland Valley Hope Partners can provide a great return on your community investment. For every \$1 donated we can return more than \$6 worth of food to the community. All of your donated food items go directly to needy families and individuals. Here's how our food program works:

How does a food drive work?

Food is collected at your place of business, your faith community, or in front of a grocery store. It is then sorted, and distributed at our four food pantries to over 5000 individuals per month who directly use the emergency food to feed their families.
