### Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

Hope Partners was delighted to play a role in October 22<sup>nd</sup> festivities which included a special Sunday service reflecting on what the faith family has meant to both the congregants and the larger community, the dedication of a peace pole in the church lobby, and a lovely luncheon in the fellowship hall. The congregation at First Christian Church is very special to Hope Partners as they have hosted our organization on their campus since our founding in 1968. Additionally, their co-pastor, Rev. Mike Fronk has been our board treasurer for many years. Congratulations!

# Hope Partners' Refrigerated Box Truck Stolen... And Thankfully Recovered!

The leadership of Hope Partners, top staff and the board of directors, were stunned when our refrigerated box truck was stolen from our Sova Food Security Center yard on the morning of Friday, October 5<sup>th</sup>. Our Food Security Manager Isaac Vega made the discovery when he stopped by the Sova Center that morning on his way to our annual board retreat meeting: the Sova yard gate lock was broken on the ground and the truck was gone! Police reports were instantly filed and of course the insurance company was contacted as our leadership team struggled to understand what kind of person or persons would steal from a charity.



Although Hope Partners does have a second truck, the stolen vehicle has been the hero of our fleet since its purchase in December of 2017. With the largest capacity, a lift-gate for easy loading and unloading of stocked pallets, and refrigeration capabilities, this truck is truly the workhorse of the Food Security Program. The loss of the vehicle was felt deeply by Isaac and his team. After weeks without hearing about the disposition of the truck, the board, staff, and volunteers lost hope it would ever be found.

Imagine our surprise when, just before Halloween, we received a call letting us know our truck had been recovered by Palm Springs PD! The truck had been abandoned and although there was some visible damage, including the removal of the Hope Partners logo wrap on one side, it appeared to be drivable! Upon further inspection, the truck was stripped of all the interior lights and trim, the locks and ignition were damaged, and the fender and grill had a few new bumps, but all the damage was relatively minor compared to the prospect of completely replacing our vital truck. The biggest detriments have been the time lost with the vehicle and that the thieves actually did make off with a recently donated electric pallet jack that had been locked in the truck's cargo box. We are happy to soon be wrapping up this saga and get back to business as normal in our Food Security Program, albeit with some important new security upgrades to our Sova yard to hopefully prevent future thefts.


