### Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland,

and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

### Blessings ...

In 2024, YOUR contributions of time, talent and treasure to the mission of Inland Valley Hope Partners have helped our agency:

- House 21 homeless families (39 individuals) in the Our House Temporary Shelter, providing them with room, board and vital services to move them forward from homelessness into a place of their own. The shelter provided some 2,923 bed nights this calendar year
  - stable



- Support 39 families with emergency rental assistance to prevent additional families from experiencing homelessness
- Issue 13 motel vouchers, providing **35 individuals with 106 nights of respite** from living on the street or other place not meant for human habitation
- Feed a total of 49,672 children, women and men with emergency, staple foods to soothe their hungry stomachs—that's enough food for a total of 745,080 meals distributed by our Food Security Program during the calendar year
- Extend the food budgets of more than 7,000 low-income families to include more fresh produce through the Market Match program offered at our Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market
- Provide nearly 300 students with a backpack full of school supplies
- Facilitate the "adoption" of **more than 100 families** through our Adopt-A-Family Holiday Gift Program helping to bring a happy holiday to a family that might otherwise have had none

We thank you for your commitment and service to our mission of feeding the hungry and sheltering the homeless here in the Inland Valley. We look forward to your continued support to serve our neighbors in need in 2025!

### **Housing Client Success Story**

Emilia's\* story begins like many others, with a life that seemed to be on track until circumstances spiraled out of control. A history of domestic violence, substance abuse, the loss of her job, and family challenges overwhelmed her, and before she knew it, she found herself sleeping in her car, moving from one motel to another. Her finances exhausted and feeling hopeless, she was caught in a desperate situation—one she never thought she would find herself in.

Despite her hardships, Emilia remained hopeful, determined to find a way forward to a better life. Thanks to a referral from VOA (Volunteers of America), Emilia became eligible for a bed in Hope Partners' *Our House* Family Shelter Program. When Emilia sat down for her interview with our case manager Karen Abram, she could hardly believe the relief she felt. "It came just in time," she said, reflecting on how long she had been waiting for a break. For months, she had been holding onto the belief that help would eventually come, and now it had.

Emilia moved into the shelter in late Autumn and got straight to work utilizing the resources, guidance, and encouragement from our team to begin to rebuild her life. She quickly secured a new job that pays good wages. Most recently, she has been able to purchase a used car which makes it much easier for her to get to and from that job. For her, this is just the beginning of what promises to be a bright future. Despite the long and difficult journey, Emilia's determination and the support of Hope Partners have helped her regain control over her life and she is confidently searching for her next step — an apartment to call her own. She now stands at the threshold of a fresh start, and with that, the possibility of permanent stability and success.

Emilia's journey is proof that, no matter how challenging the circumstances, a new chance is always within reach. At Hope Partners, we are proud to have been part of her journey and wish her nothing but success as she continues onward toward a brighter, more secure future.
