Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; SOVA, Claremont and San Dimas food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The

shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

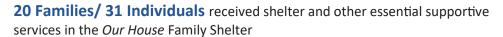
Blessings ...

Hope Partners recently completed our fiscal year, which always provides an opportunity to pause and reflect upon our activities and their impact. I thought I would take a moment to illustrate some of our highlights from FY 24-25.

43,769 Individuals served at our Food Pantry/ Distribution Locations

656,535 Meals provided

440 Families received a Thanksgiving Turkey and meal



19 Families/ 55 individuals moved from homelessness to housing through the assistance of the Rapid Re-Housing Program

28 Families/ 78 individuals avoided homelessness through the provision of one-time Rental Assistance

77 bed nights for 28 individuals assisted through Motel Vouchers

111 Families and their Children provided gifts through the Adopt-a-Family Holiday Gift Program

More than 150 Children received a backpack filled with school supplies

1,659 Families participated in the Market Match Program at our Pomona Valley Certified Farmers Market

Despite pauses in key federal funding and the conclusion of several long-term partnerships, Hope Partners continues to be a place where people can turn in their most vulnerable moments. As we begin work in this fiscal year, we remain committed to serving as a lifeline to individuals and families struggling with hunger and housing insecurity—and none of it would be possible without you. September is Hunger Action Month, and with the **Walk for the Hungry and Homeless** right around the corner, Hope Partners is offering another powerful way to fight hunger here in our local community.

The **Be A Hero Food Drive Calendar** is a fun, easy way to involve your family, friends, coworkers, and community groups in collecting much-needed food for our neighbors in need. Each week focuses on a color theme to make giving both simple and creative! Print the calendar, hang it up, establish a collection station and share the info so everyone can join the fight against hunger and homelessness.

August 17 - 23 = GREEN WEEK

Stock our shelves with veggies — canned or fresh from your garden. Nutritious and versatile, they're a staple for our food pantries.

August 24 - 30 = RED WEEK

Think tomato paste or fresh tomatoes, spaghetti sauce, ketchup, applesauce, raisins, and any other delicious red-hued foods.

August 31 - September 6 = YELLOW WEEK

Contribute sunshine-colored favorites like mac-n-cheese, pasta, cereals, oatmeal, rice, and corn.

September 7 - 13 = PURPLE WEEK

Purple stands for Protein! Bring peanut butter, tuna, canned chicken, Spam, or other protein-packed foods to help nourish local families.
