**Adopt-A-Family Program:** Bring joy to a local family by “adopting” them for the holidays! Hope Partners’ Adopt-A-Family program is a holiday gift giving program designed to help make the season joyous for families we know are struggling just to make ends meet. Parents provide a short wish list that includes both essential needs and special items to make the season brighter for their children and household. Then you shop using their wishes as a guide, and together we’ll make sure their holiday is filled with love, warmth, and hope.

We still have a few families available for adoption! Simply let us know your preferences (for example, a family of four or one with teenagers), and we’ll match you with a family that closely fits your criteria. *When possible*, gifts should be wrapped and delivered to our administrative office for distribution to our families by December 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Holiday Food Drives:** Help fill pantry shelves and dinner tables this holiday season! You can contribute by donating food items or hosting a drive at your workplace, faith community, or neighborhood. Most needed items include:

*Staple Foods:* peanut butter, chili beans, spaghetti sauce, rice, soup, beans, canned meat or tuna, cereal, baby food, baby formula, macaroni and cheese, water, pasta.

*Holiday Favorites:* canned vegetables (corn, peas, yams, green beans, etc.), cranberry sauce, boxed stuffing, instant potatoes, and grocery store gift cards for ham or turkey.

**General Toy Drives:** Help make the season magical for children in our community! Hope Partners hosts annual holiday toy giveaways for children at our local food pantries. You can help by donating new, unwrapped toys for children of all ages—or by organizing a collection with your friends, coworkers, or community group.

### Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; SOVA, Claremont and San Dimas food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

## Beta Food Pantry Nears Reopening in Pomona!

We're excited to share that construction is moving right along at the new home of the Beta Food Security Center at First Christian Church of Pomona! What was once a dusty storage space for the church is quickly becoming a welcoming, functional space designed with our clients' needs at the forefront.

A new exterior door has been installed to provide safe and convenient access for clients, while interior walls have been removed to create an open, efficient layout for food storage and distribution. Fresh paint has gone up and lobby flooring has gone down, brightening the space and giving us a preview of the space's transformation into a food pantry serving the food needs of the community. A special thank you to Fr. Florin Iftode of St. Anne's Orthodox Church for securing a donation of paint for our project. It's truly inspiring to watch the progress, knowing that every improvement brings us closer to reopening this much-needed pantry for our Pomona neighbors.

If all goes as planned, we hope to hold a soft launch for the Beta Pantry in late December/early January, allowing us to begin serving families even as we complete the final touches. Our team is eager to open this location and once again provide food, resources, and encouragement to the community—right here on the same campus as our administrative offices.

Of course, as with any construction project, costs are quickly adding up. Demolition, flooring, doors, and labor are all essential pieces of the puzzle.
