Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland,

and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

Blessings ...

Hope Partners recently completed our fiscal year, which always provides an opportunity to pause and reflect upon our activities and their impact. I thought I would take a moment to illustrate some of our highlights and challenges from this last year.



The sale of the Urban Mission property last Summer meant the end of our food pantry and urban farming efforts at that location. We quickly found a new collaborative partner, Community Partners 4

Innovation (CP4I). The organization offered Hope Partners a new home at Lopez Urban Farm so we could continue our outreach to the families in that neighborhood. With the leadership of our partners at Amy's Farm and specialized grant funding, we helped CP4I to expand the Lopez Urban Farm from **50 to 130 planting beds** and helped fund a part-time farming position. Additionally, the agencies launched the collaborative Evergreen Market Pantry in April to serve households in need in that neighborhood.

Our Food Security Program experienced a steady increase in demand as families struggled to deal with the increasing costs of fuel, utilities, rent, groceries, and other commodities. The largest surge in demand has been at our Sova location in Ontario which has begun **serving upwards of 80 households a day**. This is not surprising considering low-income families spend a significantly higher portion of their budget on necessities and are therefore typically hit the hardest during times of inflation.

Homeless prevention rental assistance continued to be a highly sought-after service this year as well. The high volume of inquiries required our team to implement a new digital waitlist system to increase the efficiency of the process. Through generous funding, Hope Partners helped 175 families remain in their home and avoid homelessness in FY 22-23. And finally, after several delays, Hope Partners is currently wrapping up the renovation of the *Our House Family Shelter* and will be operating at full capacity (20 beds) any day now. We are so excited to have made it to this point and can't wait to assist even more families and single women experiencing homelessness.

Each success and challenge serve to re-ignite our passion to serve families struggling in our community. As always, Hope Partners would be unable to assist anyone without YOUR valuable support! We thank you for your investments of time, talent, prayers, and finances to the work and mission of Inland Valley Hope Partners.

Other Ways to Give

Do you designate your **Ralphs rewards**? Please consider designating them to Inland Valley Hope Partners. That way you can help us feed the hungry by buying your own groceries! New users will need to create an account which requires some basic information, a valid email address, and a rewards card.



Matching gifts is a form of corporate philanthropy which allows companies to match their employees' donations to nonprofits. Our House Family Shelter Success Story

A young single female, **Shelby***, came to Inland Valley Hope Partners after a period of domestic violence and emotional trauma. She had previously fled an emotionally and physically abusive romantic relationship and ended up living with her family. Unfortunately, this situation was also not a healthy environment for her. She was unable to process and work through the trauma inflicted on her by her past partner when she was experiencing fresh emotional trauma in this environment. She left, but with nowhere to live and no real tools to heal her mental and emotional wounds. She arrived at Hope Partners feeling confused and lost on how to move her life forward. Fortunately, during her interview with our housing case manager, she recognized that the Our House Family Shelter might be just the program she needed to figure her life out and begin on a different, healthier path.

Shelby entered the shelter ready and willing to address her challenges head on. She attended and engaged in all case management, counseling, and life skills sessions, openly sharing the events of her journey, and seeking input from our qualified professionals to help her learn and heal. Shelby shares that this process of becoming vulnerable and transparent about her struggles and hurts has helped her stabilize emotionally and mentally and find her selfworth as a woman. She also feels she is now better equipped to handle the anxieties and emotions of everyday life which has enabled her to return to her previous employment which she loved. After nearly three months in the shelter and taking full advantage of all the opportunities and services offered to her, Shelby moved on to permanent housing for her and her adorable support animal in the city of Upland. Shelby states that her life and outlook are no longer dark and gloomy, and that she is so thankful to the Hope Partners team for helping her start a new beginning. We are so proud of the work Shelby has done to heal and restore her life and can't wait to see all the exciting things the Lord has planned for her over the next few years.
