

Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market

Inland Valley Hope Partners sponsors the year-round Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market to bring fresh, nutritious fruits and produce grown by local family farmers to the Pomona Valley residents, specifically low-income families. The market takes place every Saturday (rain or shine) at the corner of Pearl and Garey in Pomona from 9:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Our Farmers' Market is unique not only in that we are working to bring more and more vendors who are growing chemical-free produce, but we are one of the few area farmers' markets that accept federal nutrition assistance benefits (i.e., CalFresh and WIC) as a form of payment. We are also the only local market (within 15 miles) to offer the Market Match program. Provided through a partnership with Hunger Action LA, this program offers customers an extra \$5 when they spend at least \$10 of their federal nutrition assistance dollars to purchase healthy produce at the farmers' market. By using their WIC, EBT or other federal nutrition assistance in conjunction with the Market Match program at the Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market, low-income families and individuals can stretch their limited food budget to include more healthy, locally grown food items. Items available for purchase include fruits, vegetables, bread, tamales, flowers, and much more!

Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

Free Food Assistance for Older Adults 60 Years+

The LA Regional Food Bank is partnering with pantries in LA County to provide additional food assistance to seniors 60 years or older. Seniors will be able to receive a 10-12 lb food kit of healthy shelf-stable items, once a month, at participating pantries. Seniors can pick up food kits at any of Hope Partners' food pantries during operating times. Participants can expect to receive a food kit that will include various items such as cereal, peanut butter, pasta, canned tuna, canned chicken, low sodium vegetables, and many more. Older Adult participants must show proof of age. If participants cannot pick up the food kits, an authorized individual can pick up the items on their behalf. 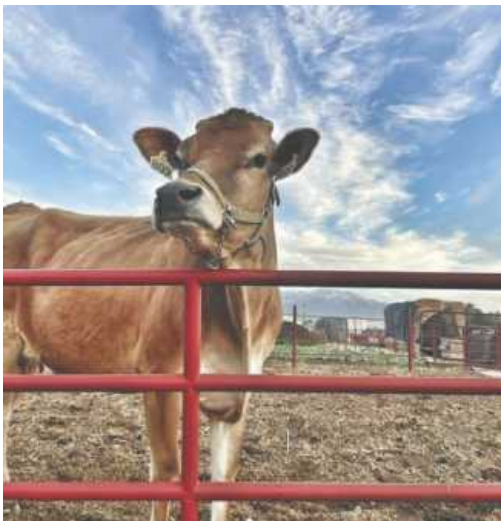
